

The year 1989 was designated as "The Year of the Coach" by the Coaching Association of Canada and, as a participant in the National Coaching Certification Program, the Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association participated.

In January of 1991, the award was renamed the "Ernie Roggie Coach of the Year Award" to honor the man who has spent a lifetime in the development of the technical programs for the Canadian 5 Pin Bowlers' Association (C5PBA). Without the countless hours and hard work of this dedicated volunteer, our technical programs would be far behind those of other sports. A tribute to Ernie's commitment is the fact that 5 Pin Bowling has one of the largest numbers of certified coaches in any sport across Canada. In 1998, the program was changed to recognize the "Grass Roots" coach.

The Coach's coaching accomplishments are many and varied as shown by the 21 provincial and 5 national events, amplified by the seven medals won at those events. In addition, this Coach has participated in over 24 events at the YBC level including three medals.

This success rate is a tribute to his ability to prepare teams and have them perform competently at different events.

In addition to the numerous coaching assignments for adult and youth on behalf of the zone plus weekly YBC coaching, he has been majorly involved within the Central Zone for over 15 years including president and past president for an extended period.

In a period where it is difficult to recruit volunteers, he has made sure that events occur with sufficient workers whom he can direct in an efficient manner to make tournaments successful.

The Central Alberta 5 Pin Bowlers Association secured its first casino license under his direction, ensuring some financial security for the organization.

From his tireless work within the zone, he has also played major roles sitting on the board of directors of the Alberta 5 Pin Bowlers Association for several years and has had a variety of roles with the Master Bowlers Association of Alberta.

Having completed the necessary course work, he became a lane certifier for the province for about five years and has pursued this several times a year through Central Alberta.

He was a member of the Subcommittee that produced the "Tournament Officials Clinic" manual in 2007 which is currently in use throughout the country.

His first love was bowling and the second coaching. Everything else grew from that. He continues to give back to and promote this sport he loves. He has an exemplary record as a coach and has shown equally energetic and diligent work on behalf of various bowling groups.
